4.6 Survey Data (Mike - absent) Jill

<u>Technical Survey - Demographic Information</u>

Q #2 Gender: Recommend changing heading from "gender" to "sexual orientation"

Recommend changing transgender to trans* and add "other" along with "Inter."

Q #3 Race/Ethnicity: Recommendation to change Native American to "Native American/Alaska Native" and then add a blank line next to "other" category so could complete the blank line with a different tribal affiliation. Recommend setting up so can select more than one

Recommend setting up so can select more than one Similar to federal guidelines.

Q#4 Religion: Recommend adding Buddhist.

Q#6 Disability/Impairment: Discussion of what "emotional" means. Recommend adding mental along with emotional.

Also recommend checking federal disability language.

Q#7 Faculty Type: What/who is intended audience? Should be more general rather than specific to protect confidentiality. Recommend including the teaching categories: Full Time Faculty, Contingent Faculty, Adjunct Faculty, Continuing Term Faculty, Term Faculty, and Graduate Assistants.

4.9 National Conference on Race and Ethnicity in Higher Education (Lesley)

Met with President and he will fund conference for two students (Mike and Joshua). He indicated he also supported faculty and staff attending but they should look at their budgets for the money to attend. If you really want to attend and do not have funding talk to Lesley.

5.0 PCOD: Membership and Leadership for 2014-2015 (Lesley)

If your term is up this year and you want to continue let Lesley know. Lesley's term is up and she will be stepping down from the committee. If anyone interested in chairing the committee see her (Lesley). Has to be a faculty member, but President might be open to having a staff member chair – would need to be discussed further. Receive "release time" equal to one course each semester. If you don't know your status (when membership expires contact Lesley). Students and community members have one year terms.

Discussion regarding meeting attendance by members and the need to develop some type

of policy regarding required attendance at meetings.

Various ideas were explored such as requiring 50% attendance or missing three consecutive meetings. However, perhaps excused absences if did not attend meeting but attended/worked on subcommittee, out of town at conference, illness, etc.

Someone needs to review the by-laws for any language pertaining to meeting attendance/absenteeism and discuss at upcoming meeting and see how to integrate into by- laws.
