Faculty survey will go out next year. Demographic question needed but will not be on faculty survey. Discussion ensued regarding confidentiality if ask question about employing department.

(Shirley) For example, if only one Native American in a department it would automatically identify that person.)

(Brian)

Maybe explain why colleges don't participate.

Perhaps voluntary participation or confidentiality note on survey.

(Mike)

Discussion about what questions should be.

Who more important to get information from, what would make things better on campus

Is it more important to get information from department or the person/employee?

To save time going to look at the demographic questions other places use/ask and then cut and paste.

Who send to: Students, subsets, all faculty, etc?.

Impossible to send to all students and so many surveys don't want to bombard students

with more of them.

Pre/Post Survey – target audience.

Identify what year and then report how freshman responded vs seniors. If ask freshman issue that they do not have any university experience yet.

Graduate students answer more like professors.

Need to take same group and do pre/post and ask about their past and present ideas on

diversity and ask to comment with recommendations.

Should develop survey that includes more staff.

Committee will research all and come back and present what the findings are before taking

action for next year.

Joshua and Troy have experience with focus groups and feedback from campus community.
